

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS




DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE


ACADEMIC PROGRESS

In its first year of operation, LPHS accomplished one of three goals and made progress toward its remaining goals. All students participated in CBI, but not all students passed end-of-course exams. Also the school fell short of earning a PI score of 60 by over ten points. Intervention and tutoring have been implemented to improve results.
